



The Man Himself

A poet, lyricist, champion for equality and father of 12, ol' Rabbie Burns was voted "the Greatest Scot" over 200 years after his death. Scots know his work, and you do too – he wrote "Auld Lang Syne" (aka the New Year's song), among hundreds of other works that are still widely read today at events like Burns Night.

Other fun facts about Rabbie:

- In 2009, became the first person to appear on a commemorative Coke bottle
- Orbited Earth over 200 times when an astronaut carried his poetry book into space
- Has more worldwide statues in his memory than all non-religious figures except Queen Victoria and Christoper Columbus
- Had a scientifically-verified larger-than-average head

It's no wonder we toast to Robert Burns, the man, the legend – but no myth!

The Grand Entrance

Bagpipes welcome guests as they arrive for supper. There is general milling about until the host arrives, takes his position at the head table, and welcomes everyone. Following in short order is the recitation of Selkirk's Grace, which is a short and sweet ode of praise to having meat on the table.

Places to Stay Around Scotland

THE GOVERNMENT SPENDS MILLIONS OF POUNDS A YEAR PROMOTING GAELIC AND HAS ENSURED THE LANGUAGE IS PLASTERED OVER EVERYTHING FROM EMERGENCY VEHICLES TO ROAD SIGNS.

But it was left red-faced on Burns Night after publishing an embarrassing translation error. An official Scottish government social media account wished Scots all over the world "Oidhche Losgadh Sona", in what was supposed to be a translation of "Happy Burns Night", alongside an image of a traditional supper of haggis, neeps and tatties.


However, the patriotic tweet backfired when it emerged that "Losgadh" was not Robert Burns' Gaelic surname but the word for a physical injury caused by heat or chemicals.

Donald Cameron, a Scottish Conservative MSP for the Highlands and Islands who took his parliamentary oath in Gaelic, said: "Whoever was responsible will be sat eating their haggis with a bit of a red face tonight. It is just as well Burns showed more attention to detail in his works than this official did in this tweet."

The Scottish government has committed millions in taxpayers' cash to Gaelic learning. It published a Gaelic plan in which it hailed the language as "an integral part of Scotland's heritage, national identity and current cultural life". A Gaelic government agency, Bòrd na Gàidhlig, based in Inverness is tasked with overseeing the plan.

A child asked for a license for a pet unicorn.

A child in California asked her local animal control department if she could get approval for a unique pet — a unicorn. The child, named Madeline, sent a handwritten letter to County of Los Angeles Department of Animal Care and Control, which they posted on Facebook.

Madeline asked for approval to keep a unicorn in her backyard, if she could find one. She asked if the department could please send her a response letter, and they did that and more.

They sent her a pre-approved unicorn license — but knowing the mystical creature (the official national animal of Scotland) might be hard to find, they also gave her a unicorn stuffed animal, with a heart-shaped pink license attached to its collar.

"It is always rewarding to hear from young people who thoughtfully consider the requirements of providing a loving home to animals," the department's director, Marcia Mayeda, wrote in the reply letter. "I commend your sense of responsible pet ownership to seek permission in advance to keep a pet unicorn in Los Angeles County."

While Madeline easily won approval for her unicorn, the license does come with some rules.

"The unicorn must be cared for in compliance with all animal caretaking regulations set forth in Los Angeles County Code Title 10," the letter reads.

THE UNICORN MUST ALSO HAVE "REGULAR ACCESS TO SUNLIGHT, MOONBEAMS AND RAINBOWS," AND BE FED WATERMELON, APPARENTLY ITS FAVORITE TREAT, ONCE A WEEK.

The department also said the unicorn's horn must be polished regularly to maintain good health.

And, since unicorns and sparkles naturally go together, the department said any glitter used "must be nontoxic and biodegradable to ensure the unicorn's good health."
